Minnehaha-Hiawatha Community Works project presents draft strategic development framework in October

The Minnehaha-Hiawatha Community Works project will present its draft strategic development framework in October. The Minnehaha-Hiawatha Community Works project focuses on the corridor that parallels the Hiawatha Light Rail Transit (LRT) line from the Midtown Greenway to Minnehaha Parkway, between the LRT line and Minnehaha Avenue.

The draft strategic development framework resulted from extensive community input and identifies 47 projects along the corridor. County staff will make presentations, and be available for questions, at various neighborhood meetings in Minneapolis.
